State, Trait and Identity: Primary Considerations in Neurofeedback with Survivors of Early Childhood Trauma.

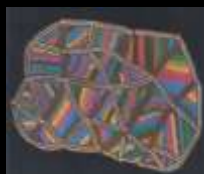
